WELCOME BACK!

Welcome back to yet another busy and exciting term in Grade Four! Dance rehearsals are underway in preparation for our night of nights! 3-Way Conferences are the main focus early this term. Meanwhile, students can gear up for lessons in history around 'The First Fleet.'

LITERACY

To tie into our inquiry topic, whole class reading this term will focus on the structure of Historical Letters in the context of simulated letters and diary entries of the convicts in the First Fleet. Later in the term we will be focusing on Procedural Texts, where students learn how to write a series of steps in chronological order, in the aim of explaining how to do something. Students will continue to be exposed to quality literature and different authors through Library visits and weekly shared reading.

During writing sessions, students will be encouraged to explore a variety of writing genres to continue to develop their knowledge and skills. Weekly formal handwriting sessions will enable students to practice and demonstrate their handwriting skills: clearly formed, joined letters and increased fluency. This term students are working towards earning their pen licences. Our weekly spelling program we will continue to build upon student's knowledge. A focus is always on using both simple and complex sentences and correct grammar in our writing.

NUMERACY

In Numeracy, our focus will continue to be on Number concepts. Students will continue to explore the place value system, recognising that it can be extended to tenths and hundredths. Work will commence in the area of fractions and decimal notation and how they are connected. Working with and understanding money, will also be a focus. Applied topics this term will include collecting, displaying and interpreting data; shapes, location, angles and temperature. Problem solving will continue to be a focus throughout all Numeracy topics.

INQUIRY TOPIC

This term we are learning about 'The First Fleet'. We will be researching the journey(s) of Early European World explorers and the areas of Australia they mapped. We will be hearing stories of the First Fleet, including reasons for the journey, who travelled to Australia, and their experiences following arrival. Students will head to Polly Woodside for a fabulous historical tour, followed by a visit to Captain Cook's Cottage.

A FEW REMINDERS

DIARIES

Diaries are to be taken home every night and brought back to school each day. Students are required to record their reading. Diaries will be signed each week on a Friday, by teachers.

HOMEWORK

Homework is generally distributed Tuesdays and is due back the following Thursday. Homework will involve topics that your children have worked on the previous week to consolidate learning and challenge their thinking. On occasion, students will undertake a different style of homework, which will be aligned with a current topic.

HOME READING

Students should be reading for 15-20 minutes every day. Home reading is to be recorded in student's diaries each night. Please help your child ensure this is completed.
